## Beak-y Bites

Most commonly known as the golden conure, and the Queen of the Bavaria conure, the golden parakeet, Guarouba, Guarouba has long been considered Aratinga. Recent behavioral ecological and morphological studies indicate it is more appropriately a monotypic genus. This Species is today listed as endangered. It is rare throughout its limited range in northeast Brazil and is lost or declining in some areas due to deforestation and forest fragmentation. Guarouba is translated as "yellow bird" from the Tupi language; this striking bird

is feathered with yellow and green of the Brazilian flag.
